## A BRIEF HISTORY OF MONEY: THE PENNY

Did you know the penny has been around for a very long time? The idea for the penny came from the British “pence,” a coin used more than 1,000 years ago. In the United States, the penny was first made in 1793. Early pennies were much larger than the ones we use today and were made completely of copper.



Over the years, the penny changed in size and design. Some famous versions included the Flying Eagle penny and the Indian Head penny. In 1909, the U.S. created the Lincoln penny to honor Abraham Lincoln. It was the first American coin to show a real person.

Today’s pennies are mostly made of zinc with a thin layer of copper. Even though they are worth only one cent, pennies are still an important part of American history. In fact, the U.S. Mint stopped making new pennies in 2026 because they cost more to produce than they were worth. While existing pennies are still legal to use, no new ones are being made, making the penny an even more interesting piece of American history!

## WORD OF THE WISE FROM DP OWL **WORD TO LEARN: ATM**

### WHAT DOES “ATM” MEAN?

ATM stands for Automated Teller Machine. It is a machine that helps people with their money without needing to go inside a bank. People can use an ATM to take out cash, check how much money is in their bank account, put money into their account, and move money from one account to another.

### HOW IS AN ATM USED?

ATMs are found at credit unions, banks, grocery stores, gas stations, and many other places. Adults often use them when they need cash for things. An ATM works with a debit card and a secret personal identification number (or PIN) to keep money safe to keep money safe.

### Activity: “Build Your Own ATM”

What You Need: A small box or shoebox; paper, markers or crayons; tape or glue; and play money or homemade paper money.

### WHAT TO DO:

1. Decorate the box to look like an ATM.
2. Draw buttons, a screen, and a card slot on paper and tape them to the box.
3. Make pretend bank cards with paper.
4. Take turns being the “ATM customer” and the “ATM.”
5. Practice: withdrawing money, depositing money, and counting how much money is left



### BONUS CHALLENGE:

Create a pretend savings goal, like saving for a toy, and track your “account balance” after each transaction!
